**Subject: Support for Actions Against South Africa's
Land Expropriation Act and Collaborative
Opportunities**

Dear President Trump,

Please accept my utmost support for your recent executive order made 7 February 2025 entitled [Addressing Egregious Actions of The Republic of South Africa](#)

Your leadership in addressing this issue is crucial to the future of South Africa as well as the issue of Land Reform and agricultural integrity globally, and I commend your

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efforts to stand against what appears to be a very significant infringement on property rights and legal principles. A development with global consequences.

Background

As the head of this [Commission of Inquiry](#) I have been privy to and accumulated an immense amount of information, experience and expertise in the issues surrounding land reform in South Africa over the last quarter of a century. My activism during that time includes some aspects that I feel needs to be taken into consideration by those dealing with the implementation of your executive order. These are: -

1. A report on South Africa [Military Intelligence interference](#) in the sector in the early days.
2. A [web page](#) and draft Book entitled `[LAND REFORM IN SOUTHERN AFRICA, The Hidden Agendas, The Scams, The Moles, The Corruption, The Victims, The Future.](#)`
3. These contain details of the letters written to various office bearers in the sector, examples of subsequent public interest *actio popularis* intervention in [litigation](#) that was brought to the Supreme Court as well as [letters from various Presidents](#) of South Africa,
4. Subsequent involvement in land reform projects lead to a key-note [address](#) at a [conference](#) chaired by the chairman of the World Banks Multilateral Investment Guarantee Agency (MIGA).
5. Please note that the South African Land Reform sector is riddled with manipulation by foreign intelligence and international organizations. Some of the activist organizations purportedly advocating for farmers are, in reality, indoctrinated, influenced, infiltrated or manipulated by foreign intelligence agencies such as the CIA, along with international bodies like the WEF, USAID, and the Royal Institute of International Affairs, not to even begin to mention Russia and China`s intelligence operations. As a result, the President`s teams should exercise keen due diligence in this exercise
 - a. As such, my insights could prove invaluable in understanding the broader implications and in formulating a response that respects both international law and the rights of individuals.
6. In April 2018 I returned to Australia just two weeks after the South African parliament passed a [resolution to expropriate white owned land without compensation](#), something that I had predicted at the [World Bank Conference](#) mentioned earlier.
 - a. At the same time, South African banks undertook to [hold the previous landowners to their bonds](#) while some had previously [on-sold those bonds to foreign banks](#) that in turn had them underwritten by World Bank backed [Multilateral Investment Guarantee Agency \(MIGA\)](#).
 - b. Most importantly, some well-known international businessmen and political activists **acquired the rights of the future junk bonds** that were to ultimately be held by MIGA. It should be easy to identify the high level of nefarious orchestration in all that. Yet another potential derivatives debacle.

7. In assisting the families of farmers that were the victims of the horrific torture, rapes and murders experience by so many farmers I have seen evidence that is so horrific that it will without any doubt cause severe trauma in most people who also see it.
 - a. This appalling genocide is directly related to the failures of the South Africa judicial system in reigning in politicians like Julius Malema that incite tens of thousands of followers regularly with slogans and songs that openly and unashamedly incite genocide.
 - b. On that issue, I might just point out that some of the organisations that supposedly are there to assist farmers in fact rejected real strategies based on proven case law which would have decidedly dealt with the issue from the very first time that he committed such universally condemned crimes.

Being from a [prominent farming family](#) that were in both boer wars, WW I and II, and having served as adjutant during the border war against terrorism on the SWA – Angola border, I am acutely aware of how history has been distorted by political propaganda, intrigue, infiltration and in some cases open betrayal by senior politicians.

Endemic media misreporting

Most of mainstream media avoid disclosing that: -

1. The Khoisan were there before any other Bantu tribes arrived to hunt them down in yet another in a string of genocides committed all through Africa.
2. That most of the land in South Africa that was occupied by the boer settlers was completely unpopulated.
3. That an extensive land reform process took place when the government bought some of the best farms from white farmers to hand over the homeland chiefs during the previous governments policy of separate development.
 - a. One of those farmers is a good friend of mine and he is still awaiting the release by the ANC government of in the region of 60 million Rand to this day.
4. They will not reveal that almost 100% of all land reform projects failed due to government interference because they never had any intention for the 'previously disadvantaged' to actually own the land, either individually or communally.

Previous presentation on weaponisation

Please permit me to also bring to your attention the [substantive submissions](#) that you received from the commission regarding your executive order aimed at preventing the political weaponization of the legal system. Context of the implicit realities expressed therein appear in an [International Strategic Planning Blog](#). As a result, it should be clear that his commission has shown a competent ability to navigate complex legal, commercial, and political landscapes. Given that previous engagement with you, I suggest that there is a synergy in information and

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capabilities that could significantly benefit your teams' efforts concerning South Africa's land expropriation issue.

Collaboration possibilities with this commission could: -

Enhance Research:

Provide a deeper understanding of the socio-political and economic impacts of the expropriation bill, leveraging the commission's research and abilities.

Strengthen Legal Activism:

Support legal challenges or frameworks that could be established internationally to counteract such policies.

Inform Political Strategy:

1. Offer nuanced political legal and commercial insights that could guide U.S. foreign policy and influence international dialogue on property rights etc.
 - a. Please refer to the **ADDENDUM** to gain more insight into what can be achieved.

Restorative Commercial Projects

Provide workable frameworks, initiatives and projects for restorative projects done in collaboration with local farmers and overseas experts that will open up new markets, establish real property rights, thereby access to finance, provide agricultural security, restore international confidence and install proper mentoring and oversight to secure sustainability and food security etc. There are strategies for significant projects that could address serious issues such as **impending water shortages** that the USA could assist with and that have the potential of securing commercial interests in respect of strategic mineral supplies etc. As we all know, most problems unlock new opportunities.

Charitable Foundations and Trusts

So as to return South Africa to the status of southern hemisphere food basket for Africa and the world, consideration should also be given to the formation of a charitable foundation and trust to which private individuals, corporations and governments can contribute. Thereby claiming some form of tax relief, rebate or exemption from contributing to the likes of Aid Agencies like USAID that have an insidious and pervasive reputation of trying to influence commercial agreements and state policies with conditionalities pushing global scams and woke ideologies.

Recovery and redeployment of state captured funds

One of the mandates that I have been given is to assist in the recovery of some **1,35 Trillion Rand** in funds highjacked by the South African government. Despite the fact that the (non-white) beneficiaries have agreed to release some **750 Billion Rand** for repairing the mess that the ANC government has created, the South Africa

government is influencing its judiciary to hold out on all sorts of contrived technical grounds, based on apartheid laws, instead of releasing their grip on these funds.

De-radicalisation and rehabilitation centres

Finally, the establishment of de-radicalisation and rehabilitation centres for politicians like Malema and those organisations that have been duped into compromise by the indoctrination, propaganda and specific (in some cases patented) psychological operations of intelligence agencies, will be crucial and creating an environment for repair, healing, restitution, re-organisation and positive growth for the region.

Other Considerations

1. The manifest failure of BEE laws, how it inhibits growth and development as Elon Musk pointed out when he [could not make Starlink available](#) and the need to abolish such endemic racism.
 - a. The RSA government wants to go even further and form a [Transformation Fund](#) that will take money from successful businesses and give it to BEE firms.
2. Decisively deal with corruption, government graft and state capture.

Top British International law lawyer of expropriation

A top British lawyer, whose specialty is international law, has predicted the consequences of a decision by the South African parliament to illegally confiscate lands legitimately acquired by ethnic-European farmers.

“You cannot have land expropriation without compensation. It is illegal under international law.

It is contrary to a dozen treaties that South Africa has signed and ratified. As such, it is a principle that is also enshrined in South African domestic law. You cannot change the Constitution, therefore, to make it legal; Treaty law is superior law, it always applies.”

"The proposal, if directed at land held by the white community, would also contravene half a dozen international treaties, notably those condemning apartheid, that South Africa since the ANC took power, has signed and ratified."

"The same argument applies above, but now with the ironic twist that any such initiative would result in the ANC being condemned under international law for actions that the world would condemn as being racist."

"So what would be the consequence of a policy of expropriation without compensation in South Africa?"

Well, as noted, such a policy would be illegal. The international community will immediately take note that South Africa has become a rogue state."

"What would happen, however, in terms of South Africa's access to the international markets is of far more concern. South Africa would have signalled that property rights are insecure. That will mean that international investment in South Africa would come to a screeching halt."

"South Africa is now ranked no. 7 in gold mining, when it used to be no. 1. It is why South Africa has a 27% unemployment rate and a 50% youth unemployment rate."

"South Africa needs access to international financial markets because it has a trade and budget deficit. It needs access to international financial markets to pay for its bloated public sector and to pay social grants to all those unemployed people."

"To raise that money, it needs the banks. Now, this is where the consequences of a policy of expropriation without compensation hit home."

"Banks have, as is the nature of banking, highly leveraged Balance Sheets. They lend as multiples of the assets they actually have. They need to conform to the Basel ratios. If they have a rise in bad debt, they can easily wipe out their Balance Sheets, they then become bankrupt, and they collapse."

South Africa has seen its black population rise from approximately 2.5million in the mid-19th century, to its current level of 50 million. The 2.5million may be taken as the sustainable level of the black population without the benefits of western medicine, western education and of modern agriculture.

"That 2.5million number is important, because only 13% of South Africa is suited for agriculture, and only 3% is high-quality agricultural land. The vast majority of South African agricultural land requires the application of modern technology."

"Farming in South Africa is highly capital intensive. Farmers depend on bank lending not only to buy their farms but also to provide essential working capital.

So, what happens if the land is expropriated without compensation if the banks then collapse? Well, it means no one is able to provide the essential working capital. If the farms then collapse, then up to 95% of the existing black population is at risk of starvation."

In closing the ANC and the EFF has proven that they don't care about the lives of black people nor whites they're not racist at all, they care only for the wishes of their oligarch masters.

Addressing Egregious Actions of The Republic of South Africa

EXECUTIVE ORDER

February 7, 2025

By the authority vested in me as President by the Constitution and the laws of the United States of America, it is hereby ordered as follows:

Section 1. Purpose. In shocking disregard of its citizens' rights, the Republic of South Africa (South Africa) recently enacted Expropriation Act 13 of 2024 (Act), to enable the government of South Africa to seize ethnic minority Afrikaners' agricultural property without compensation. This Act follows countless government policies designed to dismantle equal opportunity in employment, education, and business, and hateful rhetoric and government actions fueling disproportionate violence against racially disfavored landowners. In addition, South Africa has taken aggressive positions towards the United States and its allies, including accusing Israel, not Hamas, of genocide in the International Court of Justice, and reinvigorating its relations with Iran to develop commercial, military, and nuclear arrangements.

The United States cannot support the government of South Africa's commission of rights violations in its country or its 'undermining United States foreign policy, which poses national security threats to our Nation, our allies, our African partners, and our interests.

Sec. 2. Policy. It is the policy of the United States that, as long as South Africa continues these unjust and immoral practices that harm our Nation:

(a) the United States shall not provide aid or assistance to South Africa; and

(b) the United States shall promote the resettlement of Afrikaner refugees escaping government-sponsored race-based discrimination, including racially discriminatory property confiscation.

Sec. 3. Assistance. (a) All executive departments and agencies (agencies), including the United States Agency for International Development, shall, to the maximum extent allowed by law, halt foreign aid or assistance delivered or provided to South Africa, and shall promptly exercise all available authorities and discretion to halt such aid or assistance.

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(b) The head of each agency may permit the provision of any such foreign aid or assistance that, in the discretion of the relevant agency head, is necessary or appropriate.

Sec. 4. Refugee Resettlement and Other Humanitarian Considerations. The Secretary of State and the Secretary of Homeland Security shall take appropriate steps, consistent with law, to prioritize humanitarian relief, including admission and resettlement through the United States Refugee Admissions Program, for Afrikaners in South Africa who are victims of unjust racial discrimination. Such plan shall be submitted to the President through the Assistant to the President and Homeland Security Advisor.

Sec. 5. General Provisions. (a) Nothing in this order shall be construed to impair or otherwise affect:

(i) the authority granted by law to an executive department or agency, or the head thereof; or

(ii) the functions of the Director of the Office of Management and Budget relating to budgetary, administrative, or legislative proposals.

(b) This order shall be implemented consistent with applicable law and subject to the availability of appropriations.

(c) This order is not intended to, and does not, create any right or benefit, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or in equity by any party against the United States, its departments, agencies, or entities, its officers, employees, or agents, or any other person.

Dr. Izak Labuschagne`s Bio for News Segment on Submission:

Dr. Izak Labuschagne is a distinguished South African legal activist, born into a family of wool farmers, known for his significant contributions to fundamental rights law and land reform in Southern Africa. His activism spans back to the late 1990s, where he has been deeply involved in legal advocacy for land rights. Dr. Labuschagne delivered a keynote address at a World Bank MIGA conference in the early 2000s, where he predicted the South African government's decision to expropriate white-owned land without compensation, which came to pass in 2018.

Dr. Labuschagne has detailed the complex interplay between land reform and international finance, suggesting a level of orchestration that includes the involvement of South African banks, foreign banks, and the MIGA. In April 2018 he stated, "Returned to Cairns two weeks after the South African parliament passed a resolution to expropriate white owned land without compensation, something that I had predicted at the World Bank Conference mentioned earlier. At the same time, South African banks undertook to hold the previous landowners to their bonds while some had previously on-sold those bonds to foreign banks that in turn had them underwritten by World Bank backed Multilateral Investment Guarantee Agency (MIGA). A well know international businessman and political activist acquired the rights of the junk bonds that were to become held by MIGA. One would have to be somewhat dim witted not to identify some high level of nefarious orchestration in all that."

Furthermore, Dr. Labuschagne has raised concerns about the interference of military intelligence in land reform, as documented in his report on Military Intelligence manipulation and interference. This report suggests that elements within the military were involved in shaping or influencing land reform policies, adding another dimension to the narrative of land rights in South Africa.

He has also recently claimed that some activist organizations purportedly advocating for farmers are, in reality, influenced or manipulated by foreign intelligence agencies such as the CIA, along with international bodies like the WEF, USAID, and the Royal Institute of International Affairs, pointing to a multifaceted dynamic in the fight over land reform.
